## Coding, Coverage, and Reimbursement: Considerations for Women's Health Access

In July 2025, AdvaMed's Women's Health Initiative released this white paper in conjunction with Health Management Associates to assess the research and development landscape for medical technology used in the women's health space.

Innovating women's health products can be particularly challenging. Pulling data from a variety of sources, the paper focuses on challenges in the areas of funding, coding, coverage, and reimbursement. Findings suggest gaps in each of these areas.

Women's health is among the most **underfunded investment sectors,** with venture capital in women's health cited at 2 percent of capital markets.



Historically, federal funding for women's health research is minimal relative to total budgets (less than 10%) and **funding patterns favor the study of male-dominant conditions;** insufficient funding results in less evidence generation and affects coding, coverage, and reimbursement for medical services.



Analysis of different payer datasets found evidence of **differential reimbursement for male-centered services** relative to the (potentially) analogous female procedure.
